RESTRICTED AND UNAUTHORIZED ITEMS

Motor Vehicles: Cadets may not drive automobiles or motorcycles in Woodstock unless accompanied by their own parents.

Medications: Cadets may not keep medicines of any kind. All medications must be submitted to the Infirmary for proper storage and dispensing to cadets.

Cell phone restrictions:

Parents must register cadets' cell phones at the Commandant's Office.

Possession of a phone that has not been registered is a serious violation of Cadet Regulations.

Cell phones **may not have camera capabilities.**

Parents are encouraged to have texting capabilities deactivated.

Cadets' cell phone access is restricted each day. On weekdays, cadets may pick up their phones from Commandant's staff at 5:30 pm and must return them by 7:45 pm (before evening study period). Cadets may have their cell phones during trips off campus and while on town pass.

Electronic devices: Cadets may not possess (on campus) iPads, iPhones, or other electronic devices with internet and/or camera capabilities.

*Possession of the following unauthorized items on campus may be **cause for dismissal:***

Any type of weapon (real or toy)

Bunsen burner or Sterno can

Double edge or straight razor

Fireworks or any type of explosives

Hot pots, rice cookers, devices for heating/cooking

Lighter fluid, any type of flammable liquid

*Possession of the following unauthorized items is **cause for disciplinary action.** (Items are confiscated.)*

Tobacco products of any kind

Pornographic material

Any product containing alcohol (such as mouthwash)

CDs, Cassettes, DVDs with inappropriate language

"R" rated or Unrated movies/DVDs

Video games (including handheld)

Pets of any kind

Digital cameras

Police scanners

Walkie-talkies or 2-way radios

Laser pointers

Candles, incense, matches, lighters, ashtrays

Stuffed animals larger than 12 inches high

Hand tools or pocket tools

Pool cues/sticks

Room equipment and decorations:

Furniture (including inflatable) not issued by MMA

TVs or VCRs

Sound systems larger than clock radios

Floor stereo speakers (Desktop speakers are permitted.)

Posters depicting contraband (drugs, alcohol, etc.)

Rugs/carpets larger than 3' x 5'

Coffee makers

Black lights, strobe lights, or lava lamps

Christmas lights

Refrigerators (except as approved by the Commandant)

Air purifiers (unless prescribed by physician)

Wigs or masks

Civilian clothing and jewelry:

Any items depicting illegal activity or contraband

Expensive personal items (jewelry, sun glasses, etc.)

Heirlooms, any items of significant value
